FireSmart, Mitigation & Community Preparedness

It has been a warm start to spring following the very mild winter. The FireSmart program has been approved, and work will continue within the community on both residential homes and community centres.



FIRESMART PROGRAM APPROVED



The FireSmart program has been approved, and work will continue on residential homes and community centres. The priority will be to begin with homes that were not completed during the last round of FireSmart.



MAINTENANCE WORK

After the remaining homes are addressed, the focus will move into maintenance for existing FireSmart work. This includes cleaning gutters, trimming tree branches, managing overgrown weeds and grass, and maintaining gravel perimeters around houses and community buildings.



MITIGATION TRAILERS

Preparation has begun on mitigation trailers for the upcoming fire season. Training and information sessions are being planned to show community members how to operate the pumps and tanks, helping ensure the community is prepared if support is needed.
